Right to Life

There are several possible Right to Life events in the near future, all posing certain logistical challenges. The first is a National Night of Prayer for Life. I am trying to coordinate with the Staten Island Right to Life Vicariate for a local venue to hold a prayer vigil on December 8th, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. The second event is the annual Right to Life Mass at Saint Patrick's Cathedral on January 17th at 10:15 which will be celebrated by Cardinal Dolan. But there are some logistical issues regarding bus transportation and rider limitations so if you are interested you may have to arrange for your own transportation. Then there will be a Prayer Vigil for Life on January 22nd, the anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision. Holy Hour at 6:30 pm followed by Mass at Saint Patrick's Cathedral. The fourth event is the annual Right to Life march in Washington DC on January 29th. I doubt if there will be buses departing from Staten Island again due to bus rider limitations and preregistration requirements. And so I am again working with the Staten Island Right to Life Vicariate for a local venue for our own "march", again most likely in the form of a prayer vigil with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament or possibly a Mass. I'll keep you posted but I exhort you be ever vigilant regarding Right to Life and religious freedom issues as we prepare for a new administration and pray to Our Blessed Mother and Blessed Father Michael J McGivney that the Knights of Columbus will be blessed with the grace to be effective and successful in our mission to be staunch defenders of The Culture of Life, Catholic Family Values and Religious freedom.
